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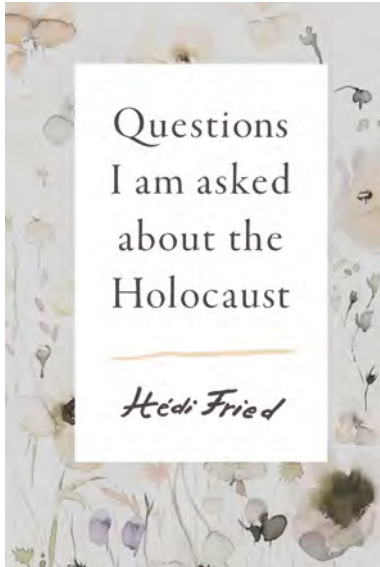
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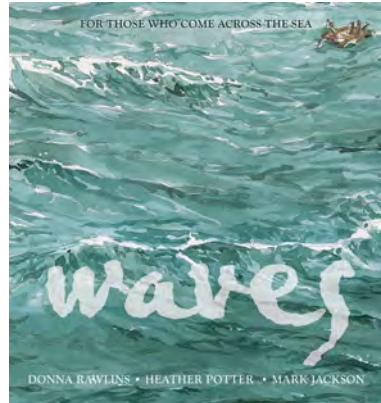
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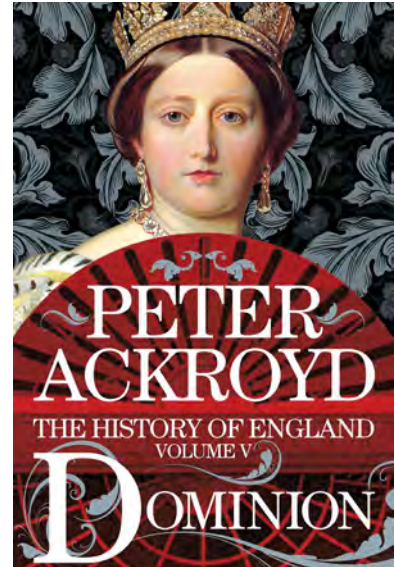
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Sungraphô submissions must be original work that has not been previously published elsewhere. Articles published in Sungraphô are subject to double-blind peer review by at least two independent experts.

The virtual tour and resources address the concepts and skills outlined in the Australian History Curriculum. Throughout, the emphasis is on history and being an historian.



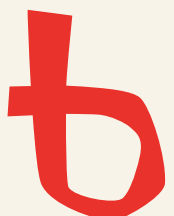
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
